Subject: RIIS Yellow Phase

Please find below how HTS is reopening safely under the Return to In-School Instructional Strategies (RIIS) Yellow Phase. You will find enclosed Health Data which supports our reopening, a Visual Representation, Virus Mitigation Strategies, and Cleaning Protocols. We are not able to return additional grades (with social distancing) to full-time in-school instruction given our building limitations. The AOH fully supports the proposed plan. We moved 1st grade from the ground floor to the 2nd floor and 6th grade from the 2nd floor to the 3rd floor. This gives us a true middle school model 6-8 on the 3rd floor. The (old) 1st grade can be used for an additional PreK or splitting Kindergarten (26 students to date). All teachers would teach from HTS everyday.

Prek, K, & 1st Grade 5 full-days in-school instruction; 2nd Grade MTW in-school instruction RF remote; Blue Group MT in-school WRF remote and Red Group RF in-school MTW remote; Virus Mitigation Strategies - Daily Cleaning Protocols.

HEALTH DATA

County Health Data/State Health Data - Data as of August 12, 2020

- State Yellow Level
 - 2 Cases Per 100 K Daily New Cases (Yellow Level)
 - 1 Infection Rate (Yellow Level) On average, each person in Connecticut with COVID is infecting 1.00 other people.
 - .7% Positive Test Rate (Green Level)
- County Yellow Level
 - 2.3 Cases Per 100K Daily New Cases (Yellow Level)
 - .98 Infection Rate (Yellow Level) On average, each person in New Haven County, Connecticut with COVID is infecting 0.98 other people.
 - .9% Positive Test Rate (Green Level)
- Wallingford Green Level
 - .28 cases per day on a 7 day rolling average (We would need 4.5 cases per day over a 7 day rolling average to move to the Yellow Level.)

AREAS TO BE CLEANED

FREQUENCY OF CLEANING

Once a day - 1 hour auto-timer

Desktops Twice a day

Chairs (arms) Twice a day

Tabletops Twice a day

Doors/Hardware Twice a day

Stairwells Twice a day

Lavatories (all touchpoints & handles)

Twice a day

Disinfect All Classrooms & Rooms

(20 Rooms) (NICE CHOOSE Quartz Lamp

100 V 36W Ozone Light Quartz)



VIRUS MITIGATION STRATEGIES

- Handwashing

- Posters and instruction from staff
- Information provided to families
- Providing hand sanitizer in all locations

- Facial Coverings

- Posters, parent information, and instruction from staff
- Information provided to families

- Ventilation

- Teachers will be encouraged to open windows whenever possible except in those cases where students with health conditions might be adversely affected
- Keep school doors open for increased ventilation limits contacts with doors
- AC is OK in the building fresh air is better
- All fans pointing out toward the window not in toward the students
